

The motif is derived from Horace Emile Jean Vernet's (1789–1863) painting "The Lion Hunt", which was first exhibited at the Paris Salon in 1839 under the title "La chasse dans la plaine du Sahara le 28 may 1933" and is today housed in the Wallace Collection in London (inv P585). 






